

Informed Decision Making and Equity in Men's Health Syllabus 2026-2027

Introduction

Supported by Novartis, the Weitzman Institute will offer a free Learning Collaborative (LC) designed to help participating health centers strengthen the care and services they provide to their patients and communities. The LC will provide tools and resources to assist health centers in engaging their patients to provide information about important health conditions, as well as encouraging patients and their families to become more active in making decisions about the care that is right for them. Specifically, this LC will focus on men's health and be offered to health centers located in Baltimore, Detroit, Houston, Los Angeles, and New York City.

Men's health is a broad topic and historically men have underutilized healthcare compared to women. Research suggests that there are multi-level (individual, interpersonal, organizational) barriers explaining these differences. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the leading causes of death among men in the United States are heart disease, cancer, and unintentional injuries. Among cancers affecting men, prostate, colorectal, and lung cancers account for a substantial burden of disease and mortality. In addition, a survey of several leading medical institutions (Veterans Health Administration, Mayo Clinic, Cleveland Clinic, Kaiser Permanente, Texas Medical Center, and Henry Ford Health System) reveals five similar areas of focus for men's health: heart disease, prostate conditions, sexual health and erectile dysfunction, diabetes and obesity, and mental health and suicide.

The health conditions on which we will focus in the LC are based on the above information – prostate conditions (cancer screening and prostatic hypertrophy) and sexual health (including erectile dysfunction). Participating health center teams will be asked to assess their education and decision support processes for men and their families related to these conditions. Teams will select one or more areas of education and decision support as the focus for their work in the LC. Since only some men experience issues related to sexual dysfunction or urinary issues, these areas will be encouraged but not required. All teams will include a focus on prostate cancer screening as all men with a prostate gland need to consider this issue. For example, each team could assess its current decision-making process and identify at least one priority gap.

Objectives of the Informed Decision Making and Equity in Men's Health Learning Collaborative

Participating health center teams will:

1. Assess strengths and areas for improvement in education and decision support for men related to sexual health and prostate conditions.
2. Design site-specific interventions to improve education and decision support related to men's health areas of focus.
3. Use quality improvement tools and skills to implement selected interventions for improving education and decision support.
4. Evaluate patient-level and system-level barriers and develop strategies to improve education and decision support for men and their families.

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Learning Collaborative Structure

- Eight monthly 60-minute sessions via Zoom occurring on the 3rd Thursday of each month
- Four QI guidance and feedback sessions
- Weekly internal health center team working meetings
- Weitzman Education Platform (WEP) for CME credit or participation hours
